Introducing CASA Classrooms For Physicians and Primary Care NETWORKS

CASA Mental Health has partnered with Alberta school divisions to deliver CASA Classrooms, intensive clinical intervention and individualized programming in local classroom settings to address the need for intensive mental health services closer to students in grades four through 12.

Treatment and supports within the CASA Classroom include:

- Comprehensive assessment to inform a focused treatment plan;
- Education related to self-management of mental health conditions;
- Medication trials and management;
- Weekly individual and group therapy;
- Weekly parent psychoeducation groups;
- Referrals to relevant community and social supports; and
- Tapered management and supported transition back to usual school and healthcare team.
- School coordinates the completion of the referral package (includes referrals from the: school, caregiver/ guardian, mental health provider and medical provider)

Referral from home school

Intake and admission

- Orientation as part of the selection/ admission process.
- Assessment of eligibility and suitability based on inclusion/exclusion criteria, willingness to participate, diagnosis, acuity, level of risk, primary concern and therapeutic milieu/ case mix.
- Assessment and individualized treatment plan for admitted patients

The classrooms are designed for students who:

- have limited symptom improvement from prior treatment;
- would not benefit from or require admission to a hospital;
- have the functional capacity to participate in programming; and
- are currently under the care of a physician, nurse practitioner or psychiatrist.

Connection to Primary Care

Referrals to CASA Classrooms are coordinated by the student's school. If one of your patients is referred by their school, you will be asked to complete a medical provider form that confirms:

- you believe your patient will benefit from the program;
- you understand that the CASA Classroom mental health team may be in contact with you during the program; and
- you will be supported to resume care for the student as they transition out of the program.

The medical provider is welcome to collaborate in the student's care while in the CASA Classrooms program.
