

CASA Classrooms Impact


CASA Classrooms is a proven model of school-based mental health care developed by CASA Mental Health and introduced in collaboration with Sturgeon Public Schools in Feb. 2023. Classrooms is working with many other school divisions across the province.

CASA Classrooms provide specialized mental health treatment in a classroom setting for students in Grades 4 to 12. These students are experiencing mental health challenges that continue to impact their home, peer and/or school life. There are currently 25 CASA Classrooms across Alberta, with three additional Classrooms set to open in February 2026, and even more in September 2026.

CASA's internal data shows the Classrooms program is helping more students improve their mental health and, as a result, their academic success.

How have CASA Classrooms improved student mental health?

Students and their caregivers report very high satisfaction with the length of time they waited for their first therapy appointment (92 per cent of patients; 96 per cent of caregivers).



Common Concerns and Improvements

Most common presenting concerns include:

- Emotional problems (97%)
- Peer relationship challenges (85%)
- Over-activity or attention challenges (80%)
- Family life and relationship challenges (68%)
- Impaired scholastic or language skills (66%)
- School attendance challenges (55%)
- Self-care or independence challenges (50%)

Percentages indicate the per cent of students with this concern

Key areas of improvement include:

- Reduction in self-injury tendencies (74%)
- Somatic (physical) symptoms (69%)
- Physical impairments (66%)
- School attendance (60%)
- Self-care or independence (59%)
- Over-activity or attention (56%)
- Peer relationships (54%)
- Scholastic or language skills (48%)
- Emotional problems (46%)

Percentages indicate the per cent of students with a clinical presenting symptom that improved.
